Mission

Rutgers School of Nursing Academic Programs

The School of Nursing provides the most comprehensive program of higher education in nursing in the state of New Jersey. The school offers an array of academic programs within three divisions: Entry to Baccalaureate Nursing Practice, Advanced Nursing Practice, and Nursing Science. Each division is administered by an associate dean, appointed by the dean and executive vice dean, who is responsible for the organization and implementation of its respective programs.
